Further to the National Spiritual Assembly's message dated March 7, 2017 to Local Spiritual Assemblies and registered Bahá'í groups regarding relations with "Heavenly Culture, World Peace, Restoration of Light" (HWPL), we have learned that this organization also uses other names in its attempts to engage with Bahá'ís and Bahá'í communities (as well as other religions and organizations), and it has affiliated organizations that may reach out to you as well. The original guidance, dated March 7, applies equally to them all. Please inform your community of these additional organizational names and ask them to decline their invitations and otherwise refrain from joining in the activities of these organizations, but to do so in a tactful manner and on amicable terms. In the future, should you be invited to participate in any activities of groups that are unknown to you or whose names you don't recognize, particularly if they originate in South Korea, please contact the Office of Public Affairs for guidance or check the Internet to see if the organization has any connections to the Unification Church or any of its subsidiary organizations.
