Each of the two events will begin with a reception for the film's creators, followed by a screening of the documentary—which is 52 minutes in length. At each event, Mr. Hooper Dunbar, prominent artist, author, well-traveled Bahá'í pioneer, and former member of the Universal House of Justice, will offer introductory remarks.
